

## **Defense Logistics Agency 1033 Program: Analysis of 2019-2020 Transfers to States for Law Enforcement Use**

**June 2020**

The National Police Foundation, an independent, nonprofit research organization, conducted a review of the Department of Defense 1033 Program, operated by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA). The intent of our review was to determine how law enforcement agencies are using the program today. Our analysis only examined the last 12 months of 1033 Program transfers (June 2019 through May 2020), using public DLA data available online. Data from prior, historical periods, may yield substantially different results.

### **What equipment items are obtained by the most agencies, across all states?**

Table 1 provides information on the number of agencies that acquired specific types of equipment. Across all states, clothing items (jackets, boots, and shirts) made up four of the top five items acquired by the greatest number of agencies. Mine resistant vehicles were acquired by 169 agencies during the 2019-2020 review period.

## What equipment items are obtained by the most agencies, by state?

There were variations in the types of equipment obtained by agencies by state (Table 2). Within states, however, most agencies tend to request clothing or uniform items (e.g., jackets, boots, pants).

## What's the estimated dollar value, by state, of 1033 Program equipment obtained over the past 12 months?

States had a wide range of value associated with transfers (Table 3). Tennessee received the most equipment by value, largely due to the quantity of Mine Resistant Vehicles obtained during the analysis period. Kansas had the lowest value of equipment transfer (of the states that received any supplies). Across all states, the total value of all equipment received totaled \$278,136,663.
